



Lesson	Activity
Phonics and hand-writing	Watch the Jolly Phonics Song , tricky word song and Play phase 1 listening games to support your child's learning.
Wake & Shake	Joe Wicks daily workout.
Literacy	<p>Learn about different types of transport. Talk about a time you have been on transport, e.g. bus, boat. What is your favourite type of transport? Look at books about different types of transport to learn more about them.</p> <p>Thursday 5th November is Bonfire Night. Learn about why we celebrate Bonfire Night. Talk about your experience of going to a Bonfire Display or seeing fireworks. Think of words to describe the sound and sight of fireworks, e.g. whizz, bang, pop. Draw fireworks and label their colours and sounds, using phonics.</p>
Choosing Time	Children can choose what to play with, this could be a creative activity, building a house from Lego or playing with dolls/people etc.
Snack	Use this time to talk to your child, encourage healthy eating .
Morning Air	Go for a walk, play in the garden, can you notice anything that has changed since yesterday?
Maths	<p>Make a set of dot cards, which have 1,2,or 3 dots in different arrangements. Hold up the plates and ask your child how many dots they have. They could then write the corresponding numeral.</p> <p>Encourage your child to make their own collections of 1,2,or 3.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Have a number hunt in the house. • Play games where you need to count to three • Represent 1,2,and three as movements (claps, jumps, clicks) or sounds (drums, pops etc..) • Sing counting songs 
Quiet time	Read a book together or have a go at this meditation
Topic	<p>Make firework pictures using paint and glitter. If the ground is dry outside you could even try creating large firework pictures on the pavement with chunky chalks—perfect for developing gross motor skills. Make a rocket using plastic bottles and scraps of materials.</p> 



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
